
MH Foods takes Vadilal to court over American Dry Fruits

MH Foods, owners of the trademark American Dry Fruits, has filed a lawsuit with the City Civil Court, Ahmedabad, against ice-cream maker Vadilal Industries to prevent it from using the trademark for its range of ice cream.

MH Foods contends that Vadilal has not changed its trademark despite repeated warnings. Advocate of MH Foods, Avesh Kayser of Kayser & Company, said: "We had sent a notice to Vadilal and they asked for a period of six months. However, since they failed to take any corrective steps, we have filed a suit against them." MH Foods claimed it has exclusive intellectual property rights to the name 'American Dry Fruits' since it has been selling dry fruits, sweets and namkeens since 1932.
